

This is a summary of my former students' results from the previous pages: Benjamin Davis scored a 33 on his final ACT. He had all four sub scores in the 30's!

Sophia Ramsay scored a 26 on her ACT in September 2016. One month later, she went up 4 points and scored a 30 on her final ACT. Her Reading increased by 9 points, from a 25 to a 34 in just 6 weeks!
